In September and October we try to choose music which gives the newly promoted choristers the best introduction to their new roles. As usual, we draw on a broad range of British and European music from the renaissance to the present day. Highlights in September and October include Brahms *Wie lieblich sind deine Wohnungen* which is included in preparation for our performance of Brahms *Ein Deutsches Requiem* in November. This is complemented by English masterpieces including Harris *Strengthen ye the weak hands* and Vaughan Williams *Valiant for Truth*. October also features the two great settings of the Evening Canticles by Kenneth Leighton, along with Kodaly *Missa Brevis* and Berkeley *Chichester Service* which represent the modern end of our repertoire. We also delve further back with Palestrina and Monteverdi, Byrd, Gibbons and Schutz all featuring. A particular delight is Dering's *Factum est silentium* on September 30th.

We are also extremely grateful to the choirs who sing for us during the October half-term break. Local choirs from Bishop Wordsworth's, Godolphin and South Wilts Grammar Schools are represented, along with the Choir of Hexham Abbey and Schola Liturgica, Netherlands as well as other choirs from London and Cumbria. As always, we offer them a warm welcome and thank them for leading our worship while the Cathedral Choirs are on half term break.

Our Sunday afternoon organ recitals restart in September at 2.30pm (with Evensong reverting to its usual time of 3.00pm) and it will be good to welcome our new organ scholar Andrej Kouznetsov, who takes his share of these.
