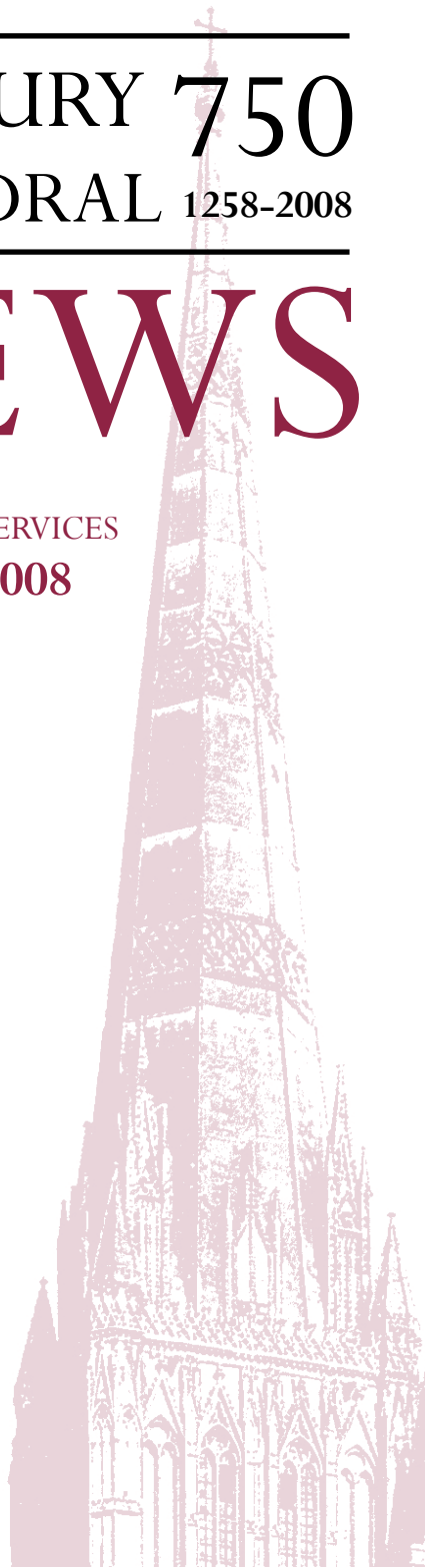

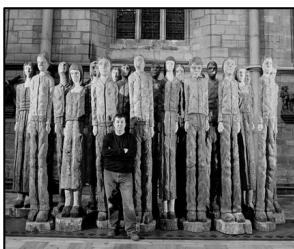

WELL TRAVELLED FIGURES



Those who read last month's Cathedral News will know that the Cathedral is hosting *Odyssey*, an exhibition with thirty-two carved wooden figures, 2½ metres tall. These figures, most of which were carved in the village of Dominikowice in Poland between 1997 and 2002, have since travelled from Poland through Krakow, the Nazi slave camps in Germany during WW2 and on to England.

At many of the locations visited artist Robert Koenig carves another figure, named after its place of creation. As *Odyssey* continues to travel the world it will have a 'Salisbury' figure. The figure will be carved sometime during the exhibition from January 21 – February 29 out of a local tree.

"THE LORD OF THE DANCE"

This will be the title of an innovative use of Lent here at the Cathedral. During this season of preparation we are going to focus on what it means to grow and be formed as a Christian. This will bring together those preparing for Confirmation and also those much further along their journey.

The programme begins with the Ash Wednesday 5:30 pm Eucharist, and is followed by four Sunday sessions on February 10, 17, 24, and March 9. After the morning Eucharist, the meetings will be held in the homes of the Dean, Precentor, Chancellor and Treasurer, and will include lunch. The day's sermon and the theme of discussion will be linked to that week's part of the programme.

Following Easter the programme will continue in a different form until Pentecost. More details will be available in a leaflet, which includes the booking form.

FRIENDS LIGHT UP THE CATHEDRAL

The Cloisters had a delightful new appearance before the Advent services this year, as the new lighting, funded by the Friends of Salisbury Cathedral, was used for the first time.

Over the last 18 months the interior and exterior lighting of the Cathedral has been totally updated, including the introduction of new energy saving bulbs. Peter Edds, the Cathedral's Head of Buildings and Estate, said "The greater control we now have over the new system inside the building enabled us to set different arrangements for our various Christmas services - as well as reduce our energy consumption."

NEW INTERPRETIVE SIGNS



Advent and Christmas - the first of a new series of interpretive signs has appeared at the Spire Crossing. Prepared by the Canon Chancellor these will provide an explanation of the different seasons and festivals in the Christian year and their significance.

They will provide additional information to visitors and a further reminder that this is a dynamic and active church within the Anglican tradition.

AMNESTY INTERNATIONAL

Blogger Karim Amer, 23 was sentenced to four years' imprisonment on February 22 for criticizing Egypt's religious authorities, the Egyptian President and Islam.

A Misdemeanor Court in Alexandria jailed Karim Amer for writing internet blogs about Islam, the Egyptian regime and the sectarian riots which took place between Muslims and Christians in Alexandria in October 2005. It is said the blogs were inciting strife and defaming Muslims on the internet by describing the prophet of Islam and his comrades as murderers, which disturbs national peace and is insulting to the President.

On March 12 the Court of Appeal confirmed the sentence. Karim Amer lodged a further appeal to the Court of Cassation on April 21 but no hearing has yet been scheduled. Karim is now in Alexandria. Amnesty International considers him a prisoner of conscience.
